Substance Abuse Group Activities - TheraPlatform

Play the role of someone who has been affected by your substance use (ex. a mother, a daughter, a friend, etc.) Others in the group will ask questions and you should answer in character. Discuss the importance of empathy and “walking a mile in someone else’s shoes.”. Discuss the importance of nutrition.

Have group members use images, colors, and words to show anger and emotional pain, such as a greenish ball in the stomach to represent guilt, or red squiggles over the eyes to show anger. Then draw healing and cooling images and words besides those emotions, such as music notes and the words “it’s not your fault.”.

One example of an icebreaker is asking each participant to share two truths and one lie with the group, and have the other members guess which “fact” is untrue. 2. Triggers.
